DAILY LANGUAGE REVIEW

Daily Language Review is a daily review of the 6th grade North Dakota Common Core State Standards. Sixth grade students are expected to be proficient on the skills that are reinforced daily, by the end of their 6th grade year. When the bell rings, students are required to be in their seat completing the Daily Language Review problems. Daily Language Review will be turned in on Friday (or the last day) of each week.

LANGUAGE NOTEBOOK

Students will be required to take notes in their Language Notebook. Notes will consist of vocabulary terms, graphic organizers, and examples. Language Notebooks must be labeled and kept neat and organized. Language Notebooks are graded for completeness and are a great tool to use to study for tests and quizzes.

QUIZZES & TESTS

Tests will be given at the end of each unit to assess the students' knowledge of the ND Common Core State Standards. Test dates will be announced approximately one week prior to the day of the test. Students are highly encouraged to study their Language Notebook, worksheets, and study guides to help prepare for their test. Quizzes will be given periodically throughout each unit to ensure the students are learning the required standards and/or to determine if re-teaching is necessary. Quizzes will be unannounced.

WRITER'S NOTEBOOK

Students will be required to engage in Writer's Notebook Activities on a daily basis. Writer's Notebooks Activities will vary from day-to-day and will consist of a variety of fiction and non-fiction writings for a variety of purposes. Many Writer's Notebook Activities will be used to launch larger writing pieces throughout the school year. Writer's Notebooks must be labeled, kept neat and organized, and will be graded for completeness.
